



## **Curtiss-Wright Controls Acquisition Timeline**

### **October 15, 2008 – Curtiss-Wright Corporation Launches a Voluntary Cash Tender Offer for all Outstanding Shares in VMETRO ASA**

(Houston, Tex.; Oslo, Norway; Sweden, France, Italy, Germany, Singapore)

Curtiss-Wright Corporation launched a voluntary cash tender offer for all outstanding shares in VMETRO ASA (Oslo: VME) at NOK 12.06 per share. The total enterprise value for the transaction is estimated to be approximately \$80 million, including assumption of approximately \$25 million of net debt.

### **October 1, 2008 – Curtiss-Wright Controls, Inc. Acquires Mechetronics Ltd. for \$2.8 million**

(Bishop Auckland, UK, and Zhuhai, China)

Mechetronics develops and supplies solenoids and solenoid valves to industrial markets. The business will be organized under Curtiss-Wright Controls Integrated Sensing group.

### **February 14, 2008 – Curtiss-Wright Controls Acquires Pentland Systems Ltd. for \$2.3 million**

(Edinburgh, Scotland)

Pentland develops and supplies high-performance signal acquisition solutions to the aerospace and defense markets. The business will be organized under Curtiss-Wright Controls Embedded Computing group.

### **September 4, 2007 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires IMC Magnetics Corporation** (Tempe, Ariz., and Nogales, Mexico)

IMC produces solenoids, fans, motors and specialized products for numerous aerospace, commercial and industrial applications. This acquisition included a subcompany, Power Systems, LLC.

### **March 3, 2005 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Indal Technologies Inc.**

(Mississauga, Canada)

Indal is a market leader in shipboard helicopter handling systems, which are essential when landing helicopters aboard naval frigates and destroyers in rough sea conditions. Indal is also a market leader in specialized telescopic hangars and has developed a number of active and passive cable handling systems for use with towed sonar arrays.



**August 31, 2004 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Synergy Microsystems**

(San Diego, Calif.)

Synergy specializes in the design, manufacture and integration of single- and multi-processor, single-board computers for VME and CompactPCI systems to meet the needs of demanding real-time applications in military, aerospace, industrial and commercial markets.

**July 1, 2004 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Dexter-Wilson Corp.**

(Seattle, Wash.)

Dexter-Wilson specializes in the design and manufacture of high-quality electromechanical components and assemblies for commercial aerospace applications.

**June 1, 2004 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Primagraphics Ltd.**

(Cambridge, United Kingdom)

Primagraphics is a market leader in the development of radar processing and graphic display systems.

**February 2, 2004 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Dy 4 Systems Inc.**

(Ottawa, Canada)

Dy 4 is a market leader in rugged embedded computing solutions for the defense and aerospace industries.

**December 4, 2003 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Novatronics Inc.**

(Stratford, Ontario, Canada, and Plainview, N.Y.)

Novatronics designs and manufactures electric motors and position sensors (both linear and rotary) for the commercial aerospace, military aerospace and industrial markets.

**August 4, 2003 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Peritek Corporation**

(Oakland, Calif.)

Peritek Corporation is a leading supplier of video and graphic display boards for the embedded computing industry.



**March 3, 2003 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Collins Technologies**

(Long Beach, Calif.)

Collins designs and manufactures Linear Variable Displacement Transducers (LVDTs) primarily for aerospace flight and engine control applications.

**April 1, 2002 – Acquisition of Spirent's Sensor and Control Assets**

(Christchurch, UK, and Irwindale, Calif.)

Penny & Giles provides position sensors and control hardware for military and commercial aerospace and industrial markets. Autronics provides aerospace fire detection and suppression control systems, power conversion products and control electronics.

**November 2, 2001 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires Lau Defense Systems (LDS) and Vista Controls**

(Littleton, Mass., and Santa Clarita, Calif.)

LDS and Vista design and manufacture mission-critical electronic control systems primarily for the defense market.

**January 1, 1999 – Curtiss-Wright Acquires SIG Antriebstechnik AG**

(Neuhausen am Rheinfall Switzerland)

SIG designs electrohydraulic and electromechanical drives for aiming and stabilization systems for armored vehicles.
